County lines drugs gangs

County Lines involves the supply of Class A drugs from the major cities - mainly London, Liverpool, Manchester, and Birmingham - to the smaller towns and cities of England and Wales.

As the big city drug operation moves in, the smaller community suffers. Houses are often taken over or 'cuckooed' by gang members who are unknown to local police or the community.



They will direct operations from a base before moving on.

Local addicts will be used as runners to deliver the drugs to buyers and deals arranged via a single phone line. Often texts will be sent out advertising special deals or details about what drugs are available.

County lines is now the preferred method of choice for gangs looking for a lucrative share of Exeter's drugs market.














- Just as an example based on the recent case of vegan extremism in Devon, I decided to type in "I hate meat eaters" into Google. This is potentially something a child could type...
- The top three search items contain strong viewpoints on veganism, as well as swearing....







The top site on the search engine is an article from a newspaper's website.

However, the text is quite vociferous in its views!

1. They insist on scoffing at you for being a vegetarian, claiming people who don't eat meat are "losers" or "stupid", when in reality they're secretly jealous because they are lacking the willpower it takes to know you will never be able to eat a cheese burger again.







Reddit prides itself on users having the right to free speech, no matter the content...

The next searches came from Reddit, which is a news / chat based website.

It is made up of subreddits, which say what the content of that page is e.g. r/vegan is for people who wish to post and comment about veganism. There is also r/antivegan...

It is pretty unregulated – each subreddit has a moderator but that moderator chooses which posts are banned and which are not.
