Attendance Matters



PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ARE CHANGING

FIRST OFFENCE

The **first** time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child. This will be reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)



The **second** time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance, the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child, to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)



The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Penalty}}$ Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court.

Magistrates' fines can be up to ± 2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guity in Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate due to failure to safeguard a child's education.
