#### Ash Class



We have had a very busy fortnight in Ash Class!

Last week, our Year 6's completed their SATs. I am so incredibly proud of how each individual approached this week. They demonstrated resilience and maturity and have show that they will be more than ready to take on their new secondary schools come September.

This week, in Maths the children have been working on their new Shape unit. We have explored how to measure in degrees and classify different types of angles.

In Science, the children experimented with water resistance. They used play-doh to create a shape that they then put forward into a class competition to see which shape would reach the bottom of a jug of water first! The shapes that performed the best had a lovely long,

smooth and streamlined shape, with a small surface area causing the least amount of water resistance.

We were also lucky enough to have a trip to Haven Banks! The children had a go at abseiling and caving and had a brilliant time.

### **Birch Class**



Wow!

What a fantastic half term it's been where we have been learning all about the Romans, botanical artists and the life cycle and process of plant reproduction.

The children were really excited to receive their scripts today for their parts in the Summer production and they are already excited to learn their lines.

Once we are back after half term, we will begin a weekly practice. Please support your child at home with their lines as the quicker they learn them and their cues the easier it is to work on the acting and staging part of things.

## English and Maths



This half term's writing has been an absolute joy and I am so impressed by the quality of the writing and editing of the whole class! They have all made a significant leap in progress since Easter and I am really impressed.

This week, we have started our new writing unit on Paddington, which the children are excited about and it will be a really extensive piece of writing that I am excited to see the outcome of.

In Maths, we have completed our final unit on Fractions with all the children showing greater understanding of what is a really tricky concept.

I am also really impressed by the leap in timestable recall knowledge, which is something we are having a major push on as we build up to the Year 4 Multiplication check.

Please ensure your child is accessing TT Rockstars at home to ensure they can rapidly write the answer using a keyboard as that is the means of the assessment in June.

#### Wider Curriculum



We have completed our unit on the Romans where the children have found out why the Roman's withdrew from Birtain in 410AD. They were quite surprised and then wrote a diary entry as a Roman soldier facing the journey of having to march back to Rome to defend the city from Germanic invaders.

In Science, we have learnt about how plants reproduce through seed dispersal and the parts of the plant including the stamen, sepal and the stigma.

In Art, we created copies of illustrations by Botanical artist Katie Scott.

In P.E. we built on our bowling and catching skills where we played mini games which including batting and fielding.

We loved our Victorian dress up afternoon and learnt lots about how Victorian schools used to work and how the children we taught and disciplined. We didn't like the dunce hat! We also had some visitors who used to go to Hennock Primary school and they talked to us about what school was like for them, what has changed, what has stayed the same and showed us some old photographs. It was very interesting and we enjoyed asking questions.

In Science, we have been looking for microhabits within the playground. We have been discovering what animals need from their habitats to survive and thinking about their diet and if they are carnivore, herbivore or an omnivore.

# **PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR** SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ARE CHANGING

#### **FIRST OFFENCE**

The **first** time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child. This will be reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

# SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)



The **second** time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance, the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child, to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

# THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)



The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court.

Magistrates' fines can be up to  $\pm 2500$  per parent, per child. Cases found guity in Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate due to failure to safeguard a child's education.
