

Ash Class



We have had a lovely, busy couple of weeks in Ash Class!

In English, the children have been working hard to consolidate their sentence knowledge. We have recapped what a simple sentence consists of and all the different ways that we can expand them into longer, more complex sentences to make our writing more interesting.

In Maths, we have been working through our unit on Place Value. We have been working with numbers all the way up to ten million! I am so impressed with the children's reasoning and problem-solving skills that they are showcasing in their work.

In Science, we have been busy investigating the viscosities of different liquids. Over the past couple of lessons the children have been conducting experiments and working scientifically to discover which liquids have a high or low viscosity.

In History, the children have been exploring the rise of the ancient Sumerian civilisation. They have analysed different artefacts to deduce what they can tell us about life in this society. We also explored why the nomads chose to settle on the Fertile Crescent and why farming was so crucial in the development of their civilisation.

Finally, all of our wonderful KS2 children took part in the Link Academy Trust's Cross Country event at Stover School this week. I was so proud of how well everybody did, with all our children completing the course!

Birch Class



The children in Birch have been working really hard in their Maths and English learning over the last two weeks. Using the text, Jack and The Dreamsack, in English we have been revising sentence structure and making sure we always punctuate our writing to give meaning to what we have written. The children have been exploring the language used in Jack and the Dreamsack and using the ideas in the story as a basis for extending their sentences with adjectives and conjunctions. Over the next couple of weeks, we will work towards writing part a fantasy story.

In Maths, the children have been exploring place value of numbers ranging to 10, 000 and making sure they remember their place holder! We've then extended this knowledge by partitioning numbers and using flexible partitioning, breaking the number down in different ways to help solve the problem more easily whilst also developing reasoning skills.

The children thrived at the cross-country event this week and it was a real pleasure to be on the side lines cheering them on. They all showed such determination and team spirit and did Hennock proud!

Willows and Reception Class



It has been a busy couple of weeks in Willows class, settling into new routines and beginning to explore our new topics.

Year 2

In English, Year 2 have been reading *Dear Mother Goose*. The children enjoyed revisiting some well-known nursery rhymes and exploring the letters from the story. They have learnt and orally rehearsed letters from the book and used these letters to look at the structure of sentences. In Maths, the children have been exploring place value, learning different ways to represent two-digit numbers and recognising how may tens and ones are in a number.

Reception Reception have been reading the non-fiction book, *All About Families* and were inspired to create some beautiful pictures of their own families – I loved seeing the detail they put into their drawings and hearing them talk about who was important to them. In Maths, they have been developing their skills in matching and grouping, using practical activities to help them learn.

Wider Curriculum This week, to introduce our history topic for the term, Willows went on a walk around Hennock to explore our local community. The children discussed which buildings might be old and which were newer, and we were very lucky to be invited to look around the outside of the old vicarage. A highlight was getting to taste some delicious apples straight from the garden trees – a real treat!

Outdoor Learning On Wednesday, we had our first Outdoor Learning session of the year. The children had a fantastic time getting hands-on with nature: creating imaginative 'blob people', splashing in the stream, and experimenting in the mud kitchen.

The new Saplings who have recently joined preschool have settled in really well, they are enjoying the free-flow system where they can move outside and back inside freely and play with their peers.

We are learning about sharing, kind hands and kind feet.

The children all really enjoyed forest school, especially the mini-bus, which is always super fun! They all had fun by the stream, and looking at the different plants surrounding us. The children all had an opportunity to make a "blob" from clay, adding leaves and twigs they found in the forest. What a fun day and we are so looking forward to going back again soon.


