Ash Class



We have had a lovely, busy couple of weeks in Ash Class!

In English, the children have been working towards their Final Write. Together, we planned and wrote our Shared Write all about our imaginary explorer Benjamin Mbuso and his journey across the South West Coastal Path. I loved listening to all the children's wonderful, creative ideas and reading their brilliant work. I am looking forward to seeing the creations of their Final Write next week.

In Maths, we have completed our unit on Place Value. This week, we focused on negative numbers and counting backwards and forwards.

In Science, we continued our series of Science experiments to investigate materials and their properties, this time focusing on how scent travels. The children sat in circles around a

scented candle and had to keep completely still to wait and see how long it took to smell it. We then repeated the experiment with Miss Fraser and Mrs Ball moving around the chairs and noticed that this made the scent travel a lot quicker!

In History, the children have been exploring how food, farming and nutrition helped the ancient Sumerian civilisation to grow and prosper. They identified how the fertile land meant that the farmers could grow an abundance of crops which were full of nutrition to feed the population. This week, we have been exploring ancient Sumerian inventions and how they made people's lives easier.

Last week, KS2 had the opportunity to meet with Lord Rooker from the House of Lords. He spoke about his role and the children had the opportunity to ask him all sorts of questions about what it is like to work in Parliament!

Finally, all of our wonderful KS2 children have taken part in two Outdoor Learning sessions so far. The children have had two lovely sunny afternoons so far at Methley Meadows building bridges, den building, exploring, and creating some delicious apple juice! This week, we began making personalised marshmallow sticks to make s'mores in our next session and recapped what we know about fire safety.

Birch Class



It's been a very busy couple of weeks in Birch. The children have taken all the knowledge they have been learning and practising about sentence structure and used this to develop their own ideas for story writing. We have very talented authors in the class and I have been overjoyed by the level of enthusiasm each child has shown when creating and sharing their ideas. The class has been awash with hurricane-like witches, scary tigers, a baby panda who missed their day out, a strange white snail, an escaping capybara, Minecraft traders and a missing Pikachu. We will move on next week to a non-fiction text all about rocks, exploring the features of a non-fiction book and learn about different rock types in order for the children to write their own information text about sedimentary rocks at the end of the sequence.

In Maths, the children have again been using their place value knowledge and applied this to using number lines and rounding numbers to 10, 100, 1, 000 and even 10, 000 in some cases. We've also been honing in on what we mean when we talk about fluency as a mathematician whilst developing our reasoning skills to be a detective to hunt for clues and solve problems in Maths.

Willows and Reception Class



We've had a lovely, busy fortnight in Willows class!

Year 2

In English, the children have been working towards their final write. They have been practicing letter writing by taking on the voices of nursery rhyme characters, asking for advice about their problems! As a class we have written a response to Little Miss Muffet.

In Maths, we have been learning to use number lines and comparing numbers and objects with the greater than (>), less than (<) and equals (=) symbols.

In DT, the children have been exploring different types of shelters, and this week they designed their own for a particular purpose, thinking carefully about the design criteria. They worked very hard building prototypes of their designs with a range of materials.

In Science, we have been exploring natural and man-made materials and their properties. Last week we investigated objects made from man-made materials and came up with thoughtful scientific questions about objects to help us discover more about them.

Reception

In English, Reception finished reading *All About Families* and created a class book inspired by the *You Choose* series, focusing on celebrating different families. The children each drew different pictures of different places families live, activities they enjoy doing and food that they like to eat with their family.

In Maths, the children have been making their own rules for grouping objects and comparing amounts of objects.

We also went on a walk around the school to explore our surroundings and then worked together to create a map of our journey.

Finally, all of Willows have been really enjoying reading George's Marvellous Medicine as a shared text. We also had a wonderful morning at Forest School, where the children made leaf crowns and enjoyed hot chocolate around the fire.

We have been painting with watercolours, mixing oats with sand, filling pots and pouring to make porridge for the three bears!

In Arts and Crafts the children have been busy sticking and gluing for our Autumn board.


We have been doing a lot of outside play, with water and sand and hide and seek has become a favourite game to play.


Will catch up with you all in a few weeks and we can let everyone know how things went for the Barn dance eve.


