Ash Class



We have had a lovely, busy couple of weeks in Ash Class!

In English, the children have begun our new unit on fairy tales. We have been exploring Neil Gaiman's version of Hansel and Gretel and discussing how it is a lot darker than the usual fairy tales that we are used to! The children have been looking at varying their sentence structures in their writing to create an effective storytelling "voice".

In Maths, we have finished our unit on Addition and Subtraction and have now moved on to studying Multiplication and Division. The children have been exploring multiples and common multiples of different numbers.

In Science, we have continued exploring our topic *Materials and their Properties*. The children conducted an experiment to replicate the water cycle. We left wet cloths in

different areas around the school and waited to see how quickly the water evaporated and they became dry. This helped us to conclude how temperature can affect different stages of the water cycle.

In History, we explored the hierarchy system in ancient Sumer. The children explored different sources including podcasts by historians and artefacts such as tapestries to conclude who were considered the most important people in Sumerian times and why.

In Outdoor Learning, the children continued working on their marshmallow sticks! We also used some junk modelling to create mechanisms with wheels and axels. The children used a saw and a hand drill to create their own wheels from branches of wood!

Birch Class



The children have been working so hard over the last two weeks. We kicked off our new writing sequence by exploring sedimentary rock and fossilisation through experiments and the sequencing of processes. We've then been using the text 'Rocks' to explore key features of an information text, all important elements ready to begin our shared write next week.

Maths has been exciting and Year 4 have had the opportunity to build on their prior knowledge of the column method to solve addition calculations, extending their problem solving skills, where as Year 3 have met this approach for the very first time. All children have risen to the challenge brilliantly.

We've also been busy practising a poem to perform at next week's Harvest Assembly as well as rehearsing our songs. We are looking forward to seeing families at the church next Thursday.

Willows and Reception Class



We've had another busy and exciting week full of creativity, learning, and adventure across Reception and Year 2!

In Year 2 the children have worked incredibly hard on their final pieces of writing. They wrote letters to Little Bo Peep, giving her advice on how to find her lost sheep. We also read a short story called "My Favourite Game" from *The Book of Hopes*, which has inspired the start of our next writing unit. In Maths, we have begun our new Addition and Subtraction unit. The children have been revisiting number bonds to 10 and exploring fact families to understand how numbers are connected. We've also started learning our 10 times table, and the children are already doing brilliantly!

Reception have loved reading *We're Going on a Bear Hunt*! We had so much fun acting out the story and creating our own story map to help us retell it. The children showed wonderful expression and teamwork as they stomped through the "swishy grass" and "squelchy mud"! Our focus in Maths has been on patterns. The children have enjoyed drawing, painting, and creating repeating patterns using a variety of objects.

As a whole class, we have finished reading Roald Dahl's *George's Marvellous Medicine* — the children absolutely loved it! It was wonderful to see several of them choosing to make their own "marvellous medicines" during free flow time, inspired by the story.

At Forest School, the children worked together to build dens, linking to our Year 2 DT topic on shelters. Their challenge was to create a play den big enough for at least four children. This week we also had great fun creating characters out of clay. The children designed and named their creations, showing fantastic imagination. We'll be taking these clay characters on some "journeys and adventures" over the next few weeks as part of our upcoming English topics.

Saplings



We have had a great fortnight in Saplings. We have been playing with the playdogh, painting fake snow chalking cutting sticking.


