Next week, we're looking forward to welcoming you into school for your Parents' Evening appointments. These meetings are a great opportunity to celebrate your child's progress so


far this year, ask any questions you may have, and take a look through their books and learning.

Birch Class



I hope you all had a lovely half term!

It's been a busy couple of weeks in Birch as ever. The children have worked hard to plan their final writes on the topic of fossils. They worked as a whole class to share ideas and to structure these into paragraphs then they had the opportunity to plan and write their own information text. I was impressed with the factual knowledge the children were able to share in an engaging way. We are now moving on to our next English sequence on poetry. The children are going to be reading the poem 'A Good Weekend' by Theresa Lola and learning about poetic features in order to write their own poem at the end of the sequence.

Birch have continued to work hard in maths applying the column method to solve addition and subtraction problems. They've then used this knowledge to explore inversion and estimation. Some tricky concepts but they're doing brilliantly!

We had the most amazing trip to Buckfast Abbey just before the holidays. I learned so much, let alone the children! They were so respectful, especially when entering the area of the abbey which requires silence and they asked so many really thoughtful questions. All the adults were so proud of every single one of the children.

Birch also did themselves proud at our recent Harvest Assembly learning an autumn poem by heart and with signs. They are a truly wonderful class and a real pleasure to spend time with each day.

Willows and Reception Class



I hope you all had a lovely half term! It has been wonderful to see everyone back this week — the children have settled in brilliantly, and we've had a very busy and exciting start to the half term.

Year 2 have continued their focus on writing all about the adventures of their tiny friend. This week, we have written introductions to our characters and collected lots of exciting vocabulary to use in our final stories. In Maths, we have been working on addition and subtraction, using our number bonds to 10 to help solve different problems.

We have also begun new topics in Science and Geography. In Geography, we explored human and physical features and played a game where we described a feature and others had to decide what it was. In Science, we drew around each other to create large body outlines and labelled all the different parts — it was great fun and helped us learn more about our bodies!

Reception have started a brand-new topic all about celebrations! This week, we talked about the different things we celebrate and how we celebrate them with our families and friends. We also learned about Bonfire Night and made some beautiful, sparkly firework pictures.

In English, we read The Three Little Pigs, which the children really enjoyed joining in with and retelling. In Maths, we have been focusing on the numbers 1, 2 and 3 — looking closely at their composition and practising finding one more and one less.

At Forest School, the whole class had a wonderful time creating foaming potions using vinegar and bicarbonate of soda. The children loved mixing in different food colours and seeing what new colours appeared!

We've also started a new class story — *The Magic Faraway Tree* — which everyone is already enjoying.

This term, we've introduced our daily toothbrushing sessions, where the children carefully brush their teeth for a full two minutes each day. It's been lovely to see how proud they are of keeping their smiles healthy and bright!

In our creative play, the children have been busy exploring the insides of pumpkins and butternut squash. Using spoons, they scooped out the flesh and seeds — a brilliant sensory experience full of curiosity and laughter. They also enjoyed making sparkly patterns with flour and glitter, experimenting with textures and designs.



Q: What are you looking forward to this half term?


A: Starting my new English unit on Poetry.

Admissions policy for 2027-28: Annual Consultation


