








Birch Class



It's been a magical, albeit busy, couple of weeks. It was such an honour to support our singers at South Dartmoor last week. They performed not only with heart and power, but also showed real technical ability and we're excited to continue our singing journey after Christmas with all our children at Hennock.

Birch have been extremely busy completing their final write in English for our poetry sequence based on A Good Weekend by Theresa Lola, planning, writing and editing a poem based on their favourite weekend or holiday memory. They all showed how they could embed the technical features we have been learning this term and each created unique and beautiful creative writing pieces. The children also used their creativity to write a separate poem about the woodland at Christmas to display at the Church for last weekend's Carol Service. The children engaged in a craft morning last week where they sewed felt holly and ivy leaves to create a garland for the window, based on the Holly and the Ivy carol, and fashioned a textured rising sun. I was so impressed with their resilience and precision when learning the stitches to sew their leaves; they all asked to do more!

We have also completed our Maths unit on times tables and the children have developed their fluency in using times table facts up to the 12 times table and are developing their reasoning skills when solving problems using multiplication and division. We'll continue on to the next multiplication and division unit after Christmas.

Although inside, Birch thoroughly enjoyed Outdoor Learning this week to create beautiful candle decorations and tree decorations ready for Christmas. They loved making and eating gingerbread cookies too.

As the term draws to a close, Birch have also had the opportunity to explore the Winter Solstice and Yule, learning about how some cultures celebrate the events and the symbolism of the plants often used as decorations. They also had the opportunity to make a glass lantern as a symbol to welcome the return of the light after the solstice on Sunday.

If all this wasn't enough, Birch also stepped up in a big way to support KS1 and Reception in the Nativity. They were incredible whether on stage, narrating or making sound effects. It was a pleasure to watch them shine.

Birch have been absolutely fantastic this term and it is a real pleasure to be their teacher. I wish everyone a restful and Happy Christmas and look forward to seeing you all in the New Year.



Admissions policy for 2027-28: Annual Consultation


