This week in Ash Class we have continued to explore fractions in maths. The children have been developing their fluency in adding and subtracting fractions and I am very impressed with the progress they are making.

In English, the children were introduced to the text *Earth Verse* by Sally M. Walker. We identified the key features of haiku poems and are going to continue to develop our poetry writing skills over the next few weeks. We also celebrated World Book Day this week and it was a delight to see all the children in the class expressing their love for reading and sharing this with younger children in the school.

In science, we created simple circuits as part of our electricity topic. We identified what made the bulbs light up and explored how altering the components in the circuits affected the brightness of the bulb.
